Chapter 1 - Introduction

In the following chapters, we will look at many topics that will enable the reader to determine what actions should be taken during any time of national emergency. Preparation and planning are the two key elements of surviving any threat. You must also decide whether you are going to stay where you are at, or bug out to a new location outside of the major cities. There are many different scenarios that we could look at, so we will stick to an economic collapse as our point of topic.

Hunkering Down

If you are forced to stay in any major city for what ever reason, you must start stocking up on your food and water staples immediately. I have been warning people now for years to start stocking supplies, because it takes years to do it properly. When an emergency of this level occurs, a person or family can not expect to just run up to the store and buy all the items you will need in one trip. Unless you are independently wealthy, it takes months and months if not years to properly prepare for a serious national or international crisis. Look over the Item Lists page for ideas on what you will want to stock and store.

The first thing you should do is purchase a water filtration/purification system. Berkey sells the best systems in my opinion and I not only bought my own, but also purchased my parents a system as well. I can not stress this point enough. If power goes out you will need a way to sterilize your drinking water. It is also a good idea to have cases of bottled water stored and also extra water storage canisters. Always buy canisters designated for drinking water storage or you could cause a health risk. Fill up your bathtub if you fear power outages. This water can be used for washing dishes, flushing the toilet and can also be sterilized for drinking water.

The Second thing is to create at least one rain barrel outside, connected to your gutter rain water drainage system located around the edge of your roof bottom. You can purchase a rain barrel or make your own fairly easily. I will show diagrams and parts needed further in this eBook. This water can be utilized in many ways for many applications and if you have to, you can always purify it and use it for drinking water.

The next thing is to start thinking about growing a vegetable garden. This can be accomplished in many number of ways. Of course if you have enough land around your house or back yard, you would obviously set up your garden in that location. If you live in an apartment or other dwelling and have no land available, there are still a few options at your disposal. One idea is to get with other neighbors and start a community garden in either a local empty lot or at a near by friends home who has the extra land. Another option is to grow Bag Gardens, balcony gardens and window ceil gardens. I will diagram each of these concepts further in this eBook.

Now it is time to figure out what exactly you want to grow in your garden. The only seeds that are acceptable are non GM (genetically modified). You only want organic heirloom seeds and they will be clearly marked on the packages you purchase. What and how much you grow will depend on how much space you have available. There are many companies selling seeds online that are credible and you can find them in the links section of this eBook.

You will want to start purchasing solar and hand crank electronic items. Depending on how much

money you have will determine what you can actually do. If you have the cash on hand to purchase a solar generator for your home, this would be the ideal solution. If you can not afford a system like this, there are still many affordable alternatives. There are many solar and hand crank products available right now that are not only easy to find, but very affordable to buy. Flashlights, Radios, cell phone chargers and so on. You can also buy a solar battery charger which recharges AAAA, AAA, C, and D size rechargeable batteries. So if your power does go out, at least you will not be isolated from the world.

Another thing to think about is heating and cooking in the event of a long term power outage. The ultimate solution is a wood burning stove. The range in price from \$130 on up into the thousands. Wood stoves have two resources, heating and cooking. Any outside BBQ grill will work for cooking but you will need to stock up on a lot of charcoal and wood chips. If you use propane, make sure you invest in extra filled bottles and keep them in a safe location. Cooking indoors using an open flame with any fuel source including wood, in not advised. A great trick to heat water for drinking coffee or tea and even cooking real food is tealight candles. You can easily construct a small frame to put around the candle/candles which you can set a small tea kettle or coffee pot on top of. You will be surprised how fast this will heat up your desired item. You can also heat up canned foods in the same way. You can purchase bags of 100 tealight candles for around five bucks and sometimes even cheaper.

What you must now prepare for is the fact that you might be looked to for help from family members, friends, neighbors and even strangers. This is an inevitable fact. It will happen and you need to think now and decide if you are going to stock up even more goods than you normally would have in order to accommodate any unknown situations that might present themselves.

Now let us talk about security issues. There might come a time when you have to defend your self or a loved one. There are many lethal and non lethal weapons available on the market. From pepper spray and stun guns to semi automatic (rifles/handguns) weapons available online and in gun shops across the country. A shotgun is also a great deterrent when used during a home breach. There are many ways to make your living area more secure and whether you are prepared to use force is a personal decision that should be left to the individual. I personally suggest buying guns and learning how to use them. In the event of martial law there is a good chance that gun confiscation will take place at some point and you will have to decide then if you are going to surrender your weapons or not. If you try and fight law enforcement and military at that moment, you will most likely die, but if we all fight then we most likely win. It really depends on many things. Are they foreign troops? Are they detaining and arresting individuals? One school of thought is to hide your unregistered weapons in another location so that if there is ever a mass U.S. confiscation of guns and ammo, you will still have weapons and ammo at your disposal.

Chapter 2 - Introduction

In the previous chapter we looked at options for people who have decided for one reason or another to stay where they are and try to survive within the major cities. Even though I do not advice this strategy, sometimes people have little choice due to many factors such as age and sickness, just to name a few examples. In chapter two we will look at options for those who want to get out of the major cities and live with more of a survivalist mentality.

Bugging Out

If you and your loved ones ever have to leave your home because of any disaster, the first question usually asked is where will we go and what will we do. This is why I have been warning people for the last few years to start making plans now so these things will not be an issue if and when the time ever comes. It never hurts to be prepared. The ideal situation is to have family or know a friend with property in a rural or secluded area that you can go to and stay for an unlimited time. Unfortunately most people do not have this luxury. So what are you going to do? Pay to camp at a national park? I don't think so.........

Depending on the disaster and what happens afterwards, you might not have the option and freedom to travel the open roads. Once martial law is ordered, all movement and traffic will cease. You are going to either have to make a plan with a definite departure date, or you will need to watch the signs around you very carefully because your window or time frame to get out of the cities could be small. The best option that I can offer you is to purchase a small tract of wilderness land that is yours to do with as you wish. Land is very cheap right now and realtors are very easy to work with in order to get rid of most of these land parcels that have no potential of ever being developed. For instance you can buy wilderness land in almost any state with no money down, no credit checks, low monthly payments and no questions as long as you make your payments on time. If you can not afford a few hundred dollars a month, then get with friends, family and neighbors and go in together on the property which will make it not only affordable, but will give you the unity of being with a group of people. Once you make your decision on which property you will invest in, it will need to be prepared. On large properties you can go ahead and set up your water storage area, mark out your garden dimensions and get to know your property on foot while observing any areas of concern that might be deemed to be a security issue. Next, post No Trespassing and Keep Out signs around the perimeter of your new property. Do not put too many signs up or you will draw attention to your sanctuary.

Over the next few months or possibly even the next few years, decisions can be made on many different topics, such as whether to raise chickens and possibly bring in other farm animals that produce food or milk. It is best to start with 10 hens and one rooster to start producing eggs. The main thing that you have to remember is this: Once you Bug Out, you must have enough supplies to last you until the next growing season, so you can produce food from your garden. Depending upon what month you are forced to leave will depend on how long you will have to survive before getting your garden actually producing food. Read as much as you can about edible plants and how to skin and dress a wild animal because it might just save your life someday. The earth is

running out of water. This is a very scary fact! You must have the ability to filter bad water into drinkable water, or you will not survive. One great way to crate small amounts is to use a water generating system. With this technique, you actually grab humidity from the air and then turn it into drinkable water. All my resources will be included within the websites included within the links pages in this eBook.

When considering hunting or defense, try to think outside the box and get a few slingshots, a blowgun, Oriental throwing stars, a crossbow and so on..... Set up some targets and learn how to use them all. Of course you will want to be well armed and in possession of a large supply of ammo. Hunting and fishing might be a necessity but make sure you buy any licenses needed now, so not to break any laws which might bring law enforcement into your life. Make observation posts in separate areas of your perimeter, where you can watch your surroundings without being seen. These can be areas that you prepare by using natural limbs, branches, leaves, plants and so on..... Set up trip wires where you fear looters may invade your perimeter. Use fishing line and small bells or tin cans tied together in a way which will crate noise and alert you that something or someone has breeched your safe zone. Even though you have Bugged Out from your original location, you should always be prepared to have to move out to other locations. This would only apply during a scenario of martial law ordered or an invasion by a foreign presence. In these extreme situations, if your presence is discovered you will be forced to fight or move on to new horizons. That decision will have to be assessed and acted upon at that time. Remember that law enforcement and active military are our brothers and sisters and will not act on unconstitutional orders. So always assess each situation separately, as not to endanger any lives that is not absolutely necessary.

The main thing is to be self sufficient so you will never have to return to the cities looking for food and/or water. So start making your plans now before you get caught unprepared. In an economic disaster scenario, most likely your worst threats will be hunger, thirst, extreme weather conditions, shelter, wild animals, looters, sickness and in extreme situations martial law could be ordered putting you at risk of arrest or could even result in your death. Stay self contained and keep a vigilant ear on your local and national news radio broadcasts. Listen to your scanner and sleep with one eye open. Listen to your gut feelings or intuitions. If something does not feel right, it probably isn't! Always be aware of your surroundings and when in a group situation, devise a night watch program which all members will rotate duty nights and schedules. You should not encounter any problems other than growing your food and enjoying your solitude, but like we have covered before: *It never hurts to be prepared*. If you follow this guide and apply it to your lifestyle, it should be a comfortable existence. If you do not, your life could be a living hell.

These lists will give the reader a good idea of what will be needed in the case of any true disaster, and will also help you prepare in a way that will make for the most comfortable survival experience as possible for you and your family. GRAB-AND-GO

Experts suggest that after any disaster, every household should be prepared to manage at least 72 hours on its own. That means putting together comprehensive survival kits for each member of the family as well as kits for your office and cars

 Water filter. This is a great backup to a bottled water supply, it will remove toxins and bacteria in the event tap water becomes contaminated or you have to rely on eternal sources such as rain or stream water.

- Gas grill. An outdoor portable propane powered grill with at least one full tank of propane in reserve as a disaster spare can cook your meals.
- Charcoal grill. Bring charcoal & lighter fluid, and when you run out, wood will work fine.
- Metal coffeepot. Caffeine withdrawal can be unpleasant, with symptoms mimicking the flu. Invest in a metal coffeepot that can withstand the extreme temperatures of a grill.
- Kids' entertainment devices. Buy yourself some much-needed peace with portable Game Boy systems or their equivalent.
- Battery-operated lights. Spend the money for a powerful flashlight that can withstand hours of use and abuse during an emergency. You'll also want to pick up a couple of battery-powered headlamps, so you don't have to juggle a flashlight. Also stock up on some battery-operated LED hurricane lamps for ambient lighting to read and cook by.
- Batteries. Even LED lights need to have their batteries replaced occasionally. Count on at least three refills of batteries per battery-operated gadget. Be sure to double-check which kind (D, C, AA, etc.) goes in each. And remember to replace all of the batteries in your disaster supplies once a year before they lose their juice.
- Weather radio. This lifesaver is a great addition to any household in the possible path of severe weather. You keep it on 24 hours a day, and normally it remains silent, but the instant the National Weather Service issues a warning the radio emits a piercing being sound. In the meantime, pick up a NOAA radio. Look for a brand with "S.A.M.E." technology, which enables you to focus the alert on your immediate vicinity. It'll cut down on annoying false alarms.

Even though this looks like a very large list of items to pack into a backpack, but I assure you that if you have a standard official deep woods backpack, you will easily be able to find places for all or most of these items. Water Storage



Water storage is critical for most situations and there are certain precautions that must be taken to ensure the health of you and anyone drinking from your storage containers. Their are many options that you have available, but it is of most importance that you only use approved storage containers to avoid any health risks. Most small water storage containers are 6 gallon or 7 gallon containers and can be purchased at any major camping store. Some are stackable. These are good to fill your larger containers located at your retreat or camping location. These are blue water storage barrels which come in three sizes of 15 gallons, 30 gallons and 55 gallons. They seal airtight and an inexpensive hand pump is available for about \$20. Liquid drops are available which will help preserve your water for up to 5 years. You can also set these barrels on their side and install a valve spigot for easy pouring. These barrels are easy to find online and I will add links in chapter five where you can purchase your own. You can also buy larger barrels that range anywhere from 100 gallons to 1000 gallons. You will need to hire a water service to fill these and is only recommended for farms and ranches. Rain barrels are another great option and can be used for many things such as irrigating your garden, cleaning with detergent or soap products, flushing a camp style toilet, depending on what unit you have chosen.

Hunting and Fishing

Everyone has their own favorite fishing pole or gun that they feel comfortable using, so I will not need to say much in this section. If you do not have a fishing pole and a tackle box full of gear, I suggest you get one tomorrow. There are many videos on Youtube that will instruct you on the sport of fishing and others that will show you how to clean and cook your fish. If you do not own a gun, I suggest that you buy one immediately and learn how to use it at your local gun range. It is well advised to buy a hunting and fishing license in advance so you will not give any wild life officers a reason to arrest you or bring unwanted attention to you, your family or your group. After you choose and purchase your gun, start buying as much ammo as you can afford each week. I suggest 3 basic weapons: A 12 gauge assault shot gun, A Semi Automatic hand gun and a semi automatic carbine with a scope.



Chapter 4 - Introduction

In this chapter I have provided directions on how we make rain barrels. Some of the tools are specialized and can be costly. However, recommended less expensive alternatives are discussed. You can put your own rain barrel together for only about \$20 in parts.

Diagrams

Make Your Own Rain Barrel



The Benefits: Water Efficiency

- Use water wisely by watering your garden with free water collected from your roof.
- Rain water is great for plants.
- Connect a soaker hose to your barrel, a great way to water shallow rooted plants such as rhododendrons.
- Use your rain barrel in areas where you may not have a convenient spigot. Near your compost pile is a good idea to keep it as wet as a wrung-out sponge, promoting the composting process during the dryer months of summer.
- Rain water is usually soft and free of dissolved minerals. This untreated water is great for your indoor plants, your garden and lawn, or washing your car.

Diversion of Rain Water from the Wastewater Treatment Plant

In older areas where storm sewers and sanitary sewers are combined, the disconnection of downspouts can be enhanced by the use of a rain barrel. Collect rain water that would have otherwise been unnecessarily treated. A rain barrel won't solve the combined sewer overflow problem, but it is a good way to help.

Some tips for making your barrel

- 55-gallon food grade quality recycled barrel.
- Install an overflow at the top. This is an important feature. A full barrel has the potential to spill additional water over the top and may cause localized erosion.
- Consider attaching the overflow to the downspout with a valve. Simply turn the valve off when the barrel is full and redirecting the runoff back into the downspout.
- As an alternative to the spigot on the diagram, purchase a spigot with a threaded nipple and simply twist it into the 1" hole.
- Do not use collected water for drinking, cooking or bathing.
- Keep the lid secure so children or animals cannot fall into the barrel.
- Disconnect the barrel during the winter to avoid constant overflow during the rainiest months. Attach it in the early spring to fill it for use.
- Most recycled barrels need to be cleaned before first use.
- If a moss killer has been used on the roof let a couple of rainfall events go by before collecting the roof runoff.
- Elevate your rain barrel slightly to make access to the spigot easier.
- The screened louver vent will prevent mosquitoes from breeding in your barrel.
- Consider joining multiple barrels for additional capacity!

Step 1

- Use a 6" hole saw, a saber saw, a keyhole saw or a drywall saw to cut a perfectly round 6" hole on the top of your barrel.
- Drill two holes with a 29/32" drill bit, one towards the top for an overflow and one towards the bottom of the barrel for the faucet.
- Next use a 3/4" NPT pipe tap and twist it into the upper 29/32" hole, then untwist the tap and back it out of the hole. Repeat this process for the lower 29/32" hole.
- Rinse your barrel out thoroughly, as it previously had a food product in it. Avoid using bleach, as it is environmentally harmful in the storm drains. For an environmentally safe soap solution use 2 teaspoons of castile soap and 2 teaspoons of vinegar or lemon juice for every gallon of water used to clean your barrel.



Chapter 4 Continued Step 2

- Twist in the threaded side of the hose adapter into the 3/4" threaded hole towards the top of the barrel.
- Prepare the threaded side of the brass faucet by:
- Wrapping it tightly with Teflon tape, make 4 or 5 rotations until all the threads are covered
- Applying a thin ribbon of Kitchen and Bath All Purpose Adhesive Caulk, or similar sealant.
- Twist in the threaded and now prepared end of the faucet into the 3/4" threaded hole towards the bottom of the barrel.

Step 3

- Cover the 6" hole in the top by placing the 6" louvered screen onto the barrel with the louvered side up and the screen side down.
- Slide a hose onto the hose adapter at the top of barrel to direct the overflow water away from your home.
- Place two cinder blocks under the selected downspout and place the barrel on this raised base.
- Cut your downspout about 4" above the top of the barrel, add an elbow, and make any final adjustments to the base and barrel.
- Add a hose on the faucet or keep it available to fill a watering can.
- Enjoy your rain barrel!

Making Your Own Bag Garden

An African Bag Garden is simply a sack filled with compost, soil and manure, with a column of stones running up the middle. It is designed to use waste water and composted food. Re-use of resources is hugely important to the families we work with, as it increases what can be grown in a small area. Find out more by following the link I provide in the next chapter.

You can plant any kind of vegetables and herbs in burlap coffee bags.

Strawberries work great, too! Here's how you do it:

Set a coffee bag in place, against a tree, under a shrub, or among a clump of perennials.

Roll down the top edge until you have the height you want.

The rounded collar around the top is gentle on plants that hang over the edge.

Fill the bag with pre-dampened, all-purpose potting soil (or fill halfway with compost and/or garden soil and then top off with potting soil). No need to worry about drainage:

The burlap bag holds moisture, yet drains well and stays upright.

Plant with seedlings, like you would a regular container. For a filled-out effect, experiment with cutting slits on the sides and poking seedlings in the holes.

Burlap coffee bags provide you with instant container gardens that adapt to any garden and landscape situation. Because they sit gently on the earth, you can use burlap containers to fill spaces and shape in, and around, existing beds.

Because they are biodegradable, plan on using your coffee bag(s) for one season. At the end of the season, they are soft and pliable. At that point, just break it apart and distribute the soil around the garden. Bury the burlap bag in the garden or in the compost pile where it will decompose. Tie medium size sticks around your bag garden to support the weight.
